
Covid-19 Protocols @ CBI

The CBI Yiddish Club met on the morning of October 23rd for its second meeting this year after a long Pandemic hiatus. Hard to believe that it was our 150th meeting since we started in 2004. We generally meet once a month, except for January and February. Our meetings are on Sunday mornings, at 10 am, and we always have a buffet breakfast provided.

Our meetings are 2 hours long and include listening to and occasionally singing Yiddish songs (which we missed last time because of an A/V problem), learning new and old interesting Yiddish vocabulary and expressions. Always a couple of jokes in Yiddish, and almost always a film with Yiddish content. At our October meeting, which took place right after Sukkot, we enjoyed the award-winning Israeli film USHPIZIN, about unwelcome guests at the Sukka in an ultra-orthodox community in Jerusalem. At our meetings, everything is translated into English for the Yiddish-challenged. At other meetings, we sometimes have games, like Yiddish Bingo and NAME THAT TUNE in Yiddish. We generally have a good turnout, often double the attendance at the Yiddish Club at the JCC in Buffalo, which Bob attends and occasionally leads. (But they don't provide breakfast).
